

### DUST, DUST, AND EVEN MORE DUST!///

Shemena is a remote and rural town in the Sidama region of Ethiopia. It takes about 45 minutes to get there by car from Hawassa. The best way to get there is by using an off-road vehicle because the last section of the journey is an unpaved and steep road. Three words describe this part of the journey accurately: dust, dust, and even more dust! The visibility is heavily reduced by the whirling dust. The approaching bikers would cover their faces with their jackets.

Once one finally gets through the dusty part of the route and the rugged mountains, a plateau with a big green meadow opens up – the marketplace. On Saturdays, local products are sold here – cattle, pulses, sugar cane, and coffee. This weekend the field is used for the gospel meeting. The gospel is for free!

It is the first time that a gospel meeting takes place in Shemena. The visitors come early and full of expectations, even though the sun is burning hot. Some are hiding in the shades of a few trees on the field, forming clusters wherever the shades fall. The vivid worship on the stage invites the people to sing along, dance or jump and makes them forget the heat. Clouds of dust rise over the field!

As the evangelist grabs the microphone it is still light. "Keeeero" he screams, and "Keeeero" is screamed back at him by the many thousands of people who attend the gospel meeting. This is the way people greet each other in this region.

A dynamic message follows. Those who attend are taken along and respond with loud Hallelujahs and Amens. Time and again Evangelist Schott demonstrates the gospel practically and vividly. On the last night, he explains that the "rod of the devil" has been broken. To demonstrate it, he breaks a stick on the stage. In this way, the gospel is well-received by those who attend.



#### DON'T LOSE FOCUS!////

The Covid-19 pandemic and dealing with it, and the escalating conflict between Russia and Ukraine, confront the world with new and unexpected challenges.

The morning events on the same field attracted primarily Christians of that region. Daniel preached about revival and unity among Christians. Kneeling in the dust and under the burning sun, Christians asked for forgiveness of their sins and those of their ancestors. In this way, a foundation for revival was laid and the atmosphere on the field changed. On Sunday Daniel urged the pastors to hug and pray for each other. Acceptance and unity were demonstrated publicly on the stage. Those symbolic and prophetic acts were a sign that revival had already started in Shemena.

The local pastors were happy about the successful gospel meeting. To show their gratitude Daniel was given a large cloth. Chris, his son, who accompanied him, was given a container filled with honey.
