

THE GOSPEL IN THE STRONGHOLD OF WITCHCRAFT ////

After more than 24 hours of travel, the German evangelist arrived in the quiet town of Bariadi in the Simiyu region of Tanzania. From April 25th to 28th, GEN held a Gospel meeting on the central marketplace there. The owners of the surrounding shops supported the event, knowing full well that the proclamation of the Gospel would drive out the present dark forces.

In Tanzania, roughly one-third of the population are Muslims, one-third are Christians, and the remaining third follow other indigenous religions. No wonder the call of the muezzin can be heard from time to time. Much more significant, however, is the fact that Bariadi is the stronghold of witchcraft in Tanzania. There is even an association, recognized by the government, that meets for public conferences. But the Gospel is unstoppable!

Even at Mwanza airport, Bishop Patrick, the coordinator of the Gospel meeting, asked the evangelist to pray because of the rain. Not without reason, as it was going to rain repeatedly over the next few days. Anticipating the weather, pavilions had been set up in advance, where visitors took refuge from the unwelcome rain. As the evangelist preached, the sun shone through the torn sky. There were also rain-free periods during the following days, allowing the Gospel to be preached.

The moral decline of Western societies is accelerating every day. The extent of the decadence was evident during the opening ceremony of the Olympic Games in Paris. The rain caused minor damages. For instance, the roof structure of the stage had to be welded after it collapsed under the weight of accumulated water. The sound system also had problems, and there were microphone failures—not surprising given the moisture and the soaked ground. A small stream formed under the mixing console. But aside from the technical challenges, the open-air Gospel meeting went smoothly.

Some visitors, however, would not stay under the pavilions during the rain. They ran into the rain to dance joyfully for the Lord—true mood-setters who lightened the heavy atmosphere. A man who couldn't be stopped by either rain or mud made a particularly strong impression. Sitting in the mud, he worshiped the Lord.

The Gospel campaign in Bariadi was a success! Many of the visitors received forgiveness of sins, among them people who gave their lives to Jesus for the first time. Several hundred were healed, some from long-standing illnesses! There were moving testimonies, including that of a boy who regained his hearing and speech. Upon inquiry, it was confirmed that he had been deaf and mute since birth.

Additionally, on Sunday morning, Daniel was able to reach the people of the area via radio. Even before the church service, he went to the radio studio of 93.5 Bariadi FM, where he preached about revival in the land.

Neither rain nor witchcraft could stop the Gospel. The harvest was brought in. Thank you, Jesus!



After an unusually challenging few months, Evangelist Schott finally traveled to the Central African Republic. This is a country that has been in civil war since 2012. To this day, rebel forces and militias are fighting in some regions. The consequences are flight, displacement, and catastrophic humanitarian conditions.

From July 23rd to 27th, people in the capital Bangui were to hear the life-changing Gospel. Daniel was one of the guest speakers and spoke during a leadership conference and at a Gospel meeting. It was

















hot in the rented basketball hall. The presence of God was there, and the conference attendees were on their knees.

During the Gospel meeting, Daniel preached about the leper from Luke 5 and how sin and sickness are related. Hundreds responded to the call for forgiveness of sins, and about 200 people were later healed! There is hope for the Central African Republic!

A Gospel meeting is planned in Bursa from November 21st to 24th. Bursa is located 370 kilometers south of Addis, in the Sidama region of Ethiopia, and has a population of approx. 150,000.

Bukavu is an overpopulated city in eastern Congo. Due to ongoing conflicts in the region, people seek refuge in the city. As a result, traffic often comes to a stand-still, along with many other challenges.

It was a busy week in July. Daniel preached at four revival events in a church, as well as on other occasions. He was invited by Dr. Dennis Mukwege, head of Panzi Hospital, who, despite his many commitments, also serves as pastor of the Sayuni Labotte Church in Bukavu.

As a doctor, the 2018 Nobel Peace Prize laureate has saved the lives of many women who have been victims of horrific abuse and sexual violence due to the ongoing conflict in the region. Through the care provided at the hospital and the work of the Panzi Foundation, the affected women are holistically helped and enabled to return to a normal life.

Dr. Mukwege is a model leader who, despite enduring six assassination attempts, continues to serve God and others with unwavering dedication while leading numerous institutions around the world.

Daniel was able to visit various facilities in Bukavu and also preach in the hospital. Both patients and doctors attended the service. The Spirit of God was present, and during the various events throughout the week, people received forgiveness of sins and healing.
