

AN OUTPOURING OF MIRACLES – OTOKUTU, NIGERIA ///

A remarkable reception awaited the evangelist upon his arrival at the airport in Warri. A number of Christian leaders and children in traditional attire greeted him with blessings and small gifts. Soon after, an impressive convoy set off: 25 vehicles, some fully wrapped with advertising for the gospel crusade, accompanied the journey to the event venue in Otokutu. With sirens blaring and under police protection, they moved through the streets, accompanied by five additional motorcycles, making the event's message visible.

A few days before the crusade, the local pastor saw dark clouds gather while on the field. In this region, the Omotogbe spirit, associated with water, is traditionally revered. He saw the clouds as a sign of spiritual opposition, but a strong wind drove them away and cleared the sky, signaling the team to pray even more fervently, knowing a spiritual battle had begun.

The three-day gospel crusade was excellently organized. People from the region were being brought to the venue by buses. A dedicated team of trained staff ensured smooth operations, while a powerful choir and focused prayer sessions shaped the evenings.

Evangelist Schott proclaimed the Gospel loudly, powerfully, and clearly. Every evening he called people to repentance. Thousands came forward to the altar – many seeking forgiveness of sins, freedom from curses, and healing from sickness. Jesus brought healing, and numerous people testified on stage about God's intervention – some even reporting multiple healings. Time and again, the evangelist asked those who had been healed, "Who healed you?" The response rang out loud and clear through the microphone: "Jesus!" He then directed the microphone toward the congregation, and the assembly responded with a resounding "Hallelujah!" – a moving moment that returned again and again during all three evenings. Many testified of healings, some after decades of suffering.



One woman was healed from a 20-year visual impairment. A man was able to move his knee pain free again after a motorcycle accident 15 years ago. Another man who had suffered from epileptic seizures for 26 years also testified to his healing. In faith, he stopped taking his medication and has remained free from further seizures.

Over the three days, well over 500 people indicated by hand gestures that they had received healing. Many went on to share their testimonies of what they had experienced. Due to time constraints, not all accounts could be shared immediately. Some testimonies were given on the following evenings and even during the subsequent Sunday service. Jesus loves the people of Otokutu!



NIGHT OF GLORY, ABUJA PRAY! PRAY! PRAY! ////

Evangelist Daniel Schott also visited Nigeria last December. Dr. David Ogbueli, leader of the *Dominion City* churches headquartered in Lagos, had invited him. As one of the guest speakers, he had the privilege of preaching at the *Night of Glory* in Abuja. The event was held at the *Moshood Abiola National Stadium*, the largest stadium in the country.

Evangelist Schott was the first preacher of the evening and delivered a timely message on the four keys to revival – a word the Body of Christ in Nigeria urgently needed. And what better place to proclaim it than the national stadium in the capital?

Preaching from 2 Chronicles 7:14, Daniel called on attendees to humble themselves, pray, seek God's face, and turn from their wicked ways. The people were deeply moved!

At the conclusion of his message, he invited everyone to kneel and ask for forgiveness for their sins. From the platform, Daniel led a heartfelt prayer, calling on God for cleansing. It was a powerful sight to see the crowd kneeling, including pastors and leaders on stage. With a loud and urgent voice, Daniel cried, "Pray!" Then he continued,

"Holy Spirit, touch Your people!" The people repented and received forgiveness through the blood of Jesus.

Next, Daniel invited the attendees to spend a moment worshipping God before leading them in prayer for their nation. He also instructed the crowd to release every prophetic word over Nigeria. After counting them down, he called out again, "Pray!" and the people began to pray.

Finally, Daniel prayed for Nigeria. In a loud and authoritative voice, he declared, "Every chain must break! In the name of Jesus!" He confronted the demonic powers over Abuja and blessed the Nigerian government. What a powerful moment, as the crowd responded repeatedly with "Amen!"

But this was only the beginning of the evening. Dr. David Ogbueli then preached, followed by an altar call for salvation. Thousands came forward to receive forgiveness for their sins. Finally, Evangelist Andres Bissoni preached and ministered to the people in the anointing of the Holy Spirit.

That night, God visited Abuja! After such a powerful event, Abuja can never be the same again!



THE GOSPEL DOES NOT BELONG IN A CORNER ////

The Gospel must be preached in season and out of season, both to thousands and to just a few. I am especially grateful when the Gospel reaches large crowds. The Gospel is God's power! It is nothing to be ashamed of, on the contrary; the Gospel must be proclaimed from the highest levels of power and influence! God always uses His people for this purpose.

... he will set you in praise, fame and honor high above all the nations he has made and that you will be a people holy to the Lord your God, as he promised. (Deut. 26:19)

God never intended His people to be hidden, but to be visible – a people who belong to Him and serve as an example to the nations. In the New Testament, Jesus picks up this idea. He calls His followers the salt of the earth, the light of the world, a city on a hill, and a light on a lampstand. Why? Not to celebrate Christians, but to proclaim the Gospel visibly in influential spaces, where decisions are made, culture is shaped, and many are listening.

That is why I am grateful for every opportunity to proclaim the Gospel both to large crowds and to influential leaders. Such opportunities are not personal achievements; they are a gift and a responsibility.

Last December, I had the privilege of being part of a preaching team. Dr. David Ogbueli invited us and gave us the opportunity to serve in Nigeria's largest stadium, the *Moshood Abiola National Stadium* in Abuja. It was awe-inspiring to see thousands kneeling in repentance and praying for their country. The Gospel does not belong in a corner; it belongs in the largest stadiums of the world!
